# 2. New and Continuing at CastiLa in 2019

CastiLa celebrates its 31 anniversary with a change of location. As you know CastiLa recently moved to San Nicolás International Education Campus around one the most famous and valued squares of the world in the very heart of the unique and universal neighbourhood of Granada, the Albaicín.

The Campus consists of three buildings nearby with office, classrooms, space for activities and apartments, public library, public school, cultural center, market places, health center, bars and restaurants in a very genuine and cosmopolitan atmosphere with unparalleled views and urban landscape.

The headquarter is located in the Casa de San Nicolás, a restored, históric Carmen with office, clasrooms, garden and a tower from where one can see the Alhambra, the Sierra Nevada and the Albaicín.

CastiLa offers its expertise and knowledge of the environment for those students who do not have enough time to join an intensive course. That is why we launched our extensive courses and courses for families.

The overall objectives are:

## ACCOMMODATION AND 24 HOUR EMERGENCY TELEPHONE

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#### **CO-ORDINATOR**

Each group is assigned a co-ordinator, responsible for determining the level of the class, planning group activities, identifying goals, deciding and co-ordinating curricular activities, contacting other groups, etc. They also solve any doubts, questions or problems within the group. He/she is the link between the students of the group and all the departments on which the welfare of the students depend.

The co-ordinator is always a teacher with extensive experience.

#### **TEACHERS**

In the selection of teachers at CastiLa, our basic requirements include:

- University degree. In Spain, a minimum of 5 years of University;
- Teaching certificate(CAP o titulación pedagógica en vigor)
- A training seminar in CastiLa with both academic and practical aspects where the style, teaching method and general working of CastiLa are taught.
- · Candidate personality and attitude are also fundamental.
- The teachers and staff of CastiLa attend Training Programs with the support of the Centre.

#### 3.3.2. Library services

With this service CastiLa wants to offer to the students the opportunity of approaching Spanish literature. We have selected a wide range of books that we will recommend taking into account your own level.

- -Beginners: stories with simple language
- -Intermediate: tales of Spanish and Latin American contemporary authors. Novels adapted to foreign students
- -Advanced: significant novels of the Spanish literature, both contemporary and classic.

Recommended books are located at the school library or at the municipal Library in the Albaicín. Books can be borrowed with the student card: The timetable of the municipal library is from 14:45 to 20:00 p.m.

According to the school's library timetable, available days for borrowing and returning books are: Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday during the break. Bring books back to reception. Before borrowing books, music of films, it is necessary to give a deposit of € 10.00 that will be returned when the book is returned.

#### 3.3.3. Other Services

**TRANSFER**: CastiLa has a transfer service that can help you to rich your accommodation in Granada. Students can book their one-way or return transfers from Granada (GRX), Málaga (AGP) and Almería (LEI). We also arrange staff to take children to the airport as unaccompanied minors.

<u>INTERNSHIP</u>: Did you want to learn Spanish while having a work experience? We can arrange an Internship programme in one of Granadian companies for you, for 4 to 24 weeks. For conditions and availability, ask Antonio.

**INTERCAMBIO**: Once in the school, we can help you find Spanish people according to your preferences to do an *intercambio*, in order to have more opportunities to practice Spanish language and get another perspective of the Spanish / Granadian culture. You can spend your free time together or invite him/her to join in extracurricular activities organised by the school. You can start thinking about his/her profile right now.

AU PAIR: We offer a selection of families for an Au-pair programme.

**STUDENT CARD**: students receive a student card on the first day that can be used for obtaining access to and discounts for several services in Granada:

- Internet / Wifi: 24 hours at the school facilities.
- Payment: students can send money directly to the school
- Arabic Baths: students can choose between two different establishments both located in the city centre
- Aquaola: a wonderful and funny aquatic park open in summer
- **Eupopcar:** discounts for renting a car
- Banco Popular: discount on commission rates for currency exchange
- Shows: discounts on tickets for all the shows that give student rates
- Library: facilities for borrowing books (there is one close to the school in Saint Nicolas square)

**RECEPTION& LIBRARY:** open from 9:00am – 6:00pm

The **head of studies** can be reached at the school during the hours 9am – 3pm for any questions/concerns you may have about your course.

**Free WIFI** is available at all times to our students. We also have computers for students to use during reception hours.

#### 4. Accommodation

At CastiLa, we consider the accommodation fundamental to the complete satisfaction of a stay so far from one's home.

How do we measure quality in accommodation? We offer:

- Accommodation within maximum 15 minutes walking distance of the school.
- Heating & air-conditioned.

Who else could offer a restored 17th century building.





The principal aim is to create the best conditions for our students. Our accommodation manager has great experience in fitting the profile of the students to that of the host Spanish families or the other students sharing the same flat.

For any issues, students can ask our accommodation manager for a change of accommodation that will be solved in 48 hours.

For this procedure, please look at our General Conditions: points 3 (3.2., 3.6 y 3.7) and those regarding families (4.1. y 4.2).

Changing of accommodation is allowed only with the Management's authorization.

#### RANGE OF ACCOMMODATION MANAGED BY CASTILA

- 1. In a shared flat with other CastiLa students.
  - With two bedrooms.
  - Location: in the Albaicín or in the centre of town. Never further than a 15 minute walk from the school.
  - Facilities: Bed sheets, kitchen, fridge, washing machine, TV, WIFI.
- 2. In a shared flat with Spanish people. For students of CastiLa who prefer to live in an absolutely Spanish environment, we are able to offer the option of a room in a shared house with friends and/or acquaintances of the staff. This preference must be indicated in the application form. The price is the same as in a shared flat with CastiLa students. Limited availability.
- In Spanish host families. For complete immersion with one of our tried and trusted families. Close to the school (maximum 20 minute walk). Because of the nature of this type of accommodation and to maximise contact with the family, we recommend full board.
- 4. Individual apartments: With one or two bedrooms, this is another high standard of accommodation offered by CastiLa, ideal for those students who prefer more privacy.



#### **5. Extracurricular Activities**

CastiLa has developed 57 extracurricular activities offered to the students, not only to enhance their stay and to provide opportunities, but to get immersed in the culture through the "ins and outs" that lie behind a language, a key part of CastiLa's teaching method. The activities, participated in by the teachers, allow the students to demonstrate, reinforce and enjoy what they have learned in the classroom.

In order to join any of our activities the student has to go to reception and sign up in a list. Natalia is in charge of those lists. The sign up has to be made at least 2 days before the extracurricular activity takes place.

A lot of the activities are free, like the *films*, *thematic evenings* and *musical evenings* in the centre... For many others, the students only have to pay for what they do: *tapas-tour*, *paella in the garden*, *dinner* in a restaurant, entrance tickets, skiing in the Sierra Nevada...

In addition, there are trips such as days out to the beach, Córdoba, Sevilla, Baeza, Mojácar... All this at a minimum price, thanks to CastiLa's connections with bars, restaurants, hotels, car and bus rental agencies.

#### 6.2. METHOD

This is a student-centred method, which considers the teacher as the facilitator and organiser of learning activities according to the student's levels, needs and personalities. Communicative, traditional and other modern activities in the classroom are selected depending on the specific characteristics of the student and his group.

Every lesson is taught by a different teacher, carefully planned by the Co-ordinator and the Academic Manager.

#### 1. Practice based on Grammar

Grammar and exercises are practised in real communicative situations. Also, correction of homework and explanation of grammar are done if necessary.

#### 2. Practice and conversation based on thematic units

Oral and written exercises; communicative activities, conversation related to the specific subjects studied, comprehension practice – audio-visual material – analysis of documents (magazines, books, television, radio) and all concerned with the communicative skills: speaking, listening, reading and writing.

#### 3. Extracurricular activities (optional)

To achieve knowledge of a language a cultural immersion is necessary. With this goal in mind, CastiLa has developed 57 different social activities that help the foreign students to integrate into the Spanish life. These activities are of very different kinds: Spanish movies, thematic evenings, musical evenings, trips, visits, parties, sports, "tapas time", "paellas"...



#### 7. Courses

How does one measure the quality of courses? That learning Spanish well is an almost obsessive objective of CastiLa can be deduced from the school's professionalism, accreditations and methodological principles. When we say that in the distribution of groups we consider the levels and specific needs of the student, we can explain with numbers: a maximum of 6 students per class in all courses, in both high and low seasons

#### 8. Welcome and Arrival

#### THE FIRST DAY IN CLASS

All the students starting a course have to be at Casa San Nicolás at 9:00 on Monday morning. After a greeting, they are given an oral and a written test in order to place students in classes according to their different levels. The written test can be done in advance to their arrival.

The test finishes at 10:20, just in time for their first lesson. At 11:15 there is a morning coffee break, when the teachers have a short meeting to confirm the levels of the new students.

This break can be used to meet the other students and learn more about the school and its organisation.

After the break, the students go on with their lessons. Textbooks and learning material (included in course price) will be given to the student at this time.

The timetable for the following days will be 9:30 - 13:35 for the 101 General (A) course and 8:35 - 14:30 for the 102 General (B) course. (See "Method and levels" on page 10)

The activity program for these two weeks will be given to the student on his/her first day at the school, along with a welcoming/informative document.

#### TRANSFER ARRANGED BY CASTILA

If requested, CastiLa can arrange for students to be collected from the airports in Málaga or Granada and taken to their accommodation in Granada

#### **RENT-A-CAR**

The agreement between CastiLa and Europear makes it possible to pick up a car at the airport and leave it at the office in Granada. According to this agreement, there are special prices for CastiLa students and it is not necessary to pay more for leaving the car in a different place.

This is also possible for departure (from Granada).

# 9. Student services, complaint forms and procedure

# 1. <u>REGISTRATION</u>, <u>PAYMENTS</u> AND <u>CANCELLATION</u>

- 1.1. REGISTRATION
- **1.1.1.** Registration in the Centre implies the acceptance of the general rules. If in doubt, please check with Management. Management has the right to make the final decision and agrees to inform of the decision taken as soon as possible.



- **1.1.2.** In order to be registered for a course, send an application form by e-mail, ordinary mail or fax; you can book by telephone as well. To maintain the booking you need to send a minimum deposit of € 120.00. This deposit is not an additional cost.
- **1.1.3.** We appreciate receiving your registration as soon as possible, in order to arrange everything for your reservation. In return, you will get a confirmation of your course and accommodation, detailed information and a bill for your booking. Registration at the last moment depends on availability.

#### 1.2. PAYMENTS

- **1.2.1.** The total payment will be made before starting, or within the first three days of the course.
- **1.2.2.** The deposit and the total payment can be made by:
- Bank transfer, indicating your name to Sociedad Andaluza de Estudios Hispánicos, International Banking Account Number (IBAN) ES64 0075 0010 0106 0628 2567; swift code (Bank Identification Code BIC): POPUESMM, BANCO POPULAR ESPAÑOL. Calle Acera del Casino, 5. 18009. Granada. All bank charges are at the expense of the applicant. Please add €10.00 to cover these bank charges. Any excess payment will be refunded. The real amount received by CastiLa will be shown in the corresponding bank statement.
- **Credit card** (Visa and MasterCard), sending the number and expiry date by email, fax, telephone or in the school's office. Commission charge of 2% is at the expense of the applicant.
- Cash in the school's office.
- Paypal.
- **1.2.3.** The bill will made by applying the fees published in the current year. According to this point, any occasional error in receipt, invoice, e-mail or letter will be corrected.

#### 1.3. CANCELLATIONS

- **1.3.1.** In case that cancellation is communicated at least 15 days before the starting date of the staying the full amount will be refunded, except for the €120.00 deposit. This deposit can be used as a payment for another course starting in the next two years.
- **1.3.2.** In case that cancellation is communicated in less than 15 days before the starting date the student will be required to pay two weeks of the course and accommodation fees. This amount can be used as a payment for a future course. The difference of the amount paid will be refunded.
- **1.3.3.** Once the course has begun, total or partial cancellation of the course is not acceptable. If the course still has to be paid, the student will be required to pay the full costs. Management will give the possibility of postponing the booking of the course to other period. In order to grant this, a signed, stamped and transferable document will be handed to the student. Regarding accommodation, 2 weeks fees of the outstanding booking have to be paid.

#### 2. COURSES

#### 2.1. DISTRIBUTION OF LEVELS

**2.1.1.**The distribution of courses and levels is the responsibility of the teaching team, who, considering the test, interview and language needs of the student, will make the final decision of where the student will be placed. Levels and their distribution will be established on the first Monday of the course after the interview and the test -this means that you will begin in your appropriate level at 11:50 in the same morning.



- **2.1.2.** The criteria that justify these decisions will be strictly academic. The maximum number of students will be 6, but exceptionally, and with the unanimous approval of all participants, it could be increased.
- **2.1.3.** Since it is the aim of the academic directorate to arrange that the study groups whilst working at the highest level possible are also made up of a minimum number of students within the group, it may happen that a group consists of one student only. Such being the case, the student who attends an intensive language course will receive half of the classes reserved (which will comprise grammar and other theoretical contents of the program) in a private class and the other half (the conversational activities of the program) with the group at the nearest available level. The student who attends a specific purpose course will receive 70% of this course; the other 30% may be attended in an intensive language course.

#### 2.2. CHANGING GROUP

- **2.2.1.** The student who considers changing group convenient for him must consult a teacher. The teacher and the Academic Manager will decide whether the change is appropriate and/or beneficial to the student or not.
- **2.2.2.** Changing the course from 101 General (A) into 102 General (B) is possible. Changing the course from 102 General (B) into 101 General (A) usually is not possible because it is considered a way of cancellation.

#### 2.3. EXTENSION OF COURSES

**2.3.1.** Extending a course must be requested and approved by Management, who will formally agree to communicate the decision within 24 hours. Please ask for it as soon as possible: the sooner the asking for an extension is addressed to Management, the more benefits you will have for organising the stay.

- **2.3.2.** If course subscription is extended, the price will be calculated according to the total number of weeks; that results in a cheaper cost than considering it a new booking.
- **2.3.3.** The participation in a course goes from Monday to the Friday of the last week of stay. Prolongation to make up for any lost days (including holidays when there is no class), until the following Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday can be considered by Management, and if approved, would be free of charge. Usually, it is possible if the group remains open.
- **2.3.4.** The beginning and/or departure at different days must be accepted by Management, and the extra price can be checked in our website.

#### 2.4. SCHOOL MATERIALS

- **2.4.1.** The Centre provides for the necessary materials, including a grammar book and exercises every week that correspond to the student level. They belong to the student and is included in the fee.
- **2.4.2.** The registration also includes the use of all school materials available at the Centre. These materials are the property of the school. If used, must be returned to the school prior to departure.
- **2.4.3.** The use of books and related materials must be made according to the normal and customary rules of loans: that is to say, it is forbidden to mark and/or write on them; in addition, they must be returned in the same good condition they were received.
- **2.4.4.** The school will facilitate the acquisition of most of the materials used, with no guarantees.



#### 2.5. DIPLOMAS AND CERTIFICATES

- **2.5.1** At the end of the course, students can obtain a certificate of attendance. To obtain this certificate, a 90% or more attendance rate is necessary. It means that the right to obtain this certificate will be cancelled if non-justified absences are superior to 10 %.
- **2.5.2.** You can obtain a certificate of level. It will implicate some specific tests organised by the Academic Management of the School.
- **2.5.3.** All certificates include administrative costs of € 5.00.

#### 3. ACCOMMODATION

- **3.1.** The price of the school's accommodation includes bedclothes (sheets, towels and blankets). It also includes electricity, gas, water, heating, community tax and cleaning (once a week, minimum).
- **3.2.** Placement of the students is the responsibility of the school. The school will always consider, to ensure the best possible placement, the criteria of distance, number of people to share the place, status, age, etc.
- **3.3.** Accommodation lasts from Sunday to the Saturday of the last week of stay. Arrival before Sunday and / or extension until Sunday will be considered by Management. Apply for it.
- **3.4.** For arrival and departure at different days, the extra price can be checked in our website.
- **3.5.** Double room and bookings: The double room is guaranteed for those students/companions that booked a room for two in advance. In case of one

person booking a double room and no other reservation to complete it in the same period, the student will be placed in a single room regime, as far as price and billing are concerned.

**3.6.** Changing of accommodation will be possible when Management finds it feasible.

#### 4. FAMILIES

- **4.1.** As far as the Spanish family regime is concerted, all responsibility belongs to the school. This should be taken into account and consideration concerning to possible complaints, charges, extension of staying and/or any other requests.
- **4.2.** All payments must always be made via the Administration of the school. Any extension of staying must be requested to and approved by Management.
